



## **Voluntary Residential Community (6 or 12 months)**

This role would be suitable for:

- Someone exploring a call to full-time Christian ministry.
- Someone with a desire to live and serve in community and is interested in the ministry of healing.

**About the Centre:** Harnhill Centre of Christian Healing is set within a 16th century manor house nestled in the Cotswold countryside. The Centre offers retreats for those seeking time and space, personal prayer ministry, practical teaching or simply rest and refreshment and to receive the healing love of God. As a charitable Anglican foundation, the Centre is overseen by a board of trustees and the ministry is ecumenical in approach. The Centre Director leads the staff team (six of whom live within the community) who are vital to the daily running and spiritual life of the Centre. The ministry is also supported by a large group of volunteers who live locally or stay residentially.

**About this role:** A new member of the residential community will be expected take an active role in a range of hospitality tasks, which may include serving meals, helping in the kitchen or with housekeeping, to ensure guests are well looked after during their visit. Each team member's personal and communal faith journey is of utmost importance and time spent at Harnhill provides an opportunity to grow spiritually and explore areas of gifting. There is also an opportunity to take part in the daily rhythm of worship and attend the Centre's training programme, as well as being assigned a mentor to work alongside. The working pattern of the residential community includes 4 days off during a two-week period. As this is not an employed role, a small monthly allowance will be given, along with accommodation (a one-person bedsit) and all meals. Please note that as there is no public transport directly to the Centre, it is recommended that applicants have their own car.
